

## **Celebrating Excellence and Service Site Improvements**

#### **Clinical Excellence Award Winner**

Each year, the Western Clinician's Network (WCN) and the California Primary Care Association host the Region IX Clinical Leadership Conference, which is attended by health center leaders and stakeholders across the region that includes Hawaii, California, Arizona, Nevada, and the Pacific Islands. This year's conference was held from June 25 to 27 in San Diego.

At the annual conference, the WCN awards a

Clinical Excellence Award to a provider who has gone above and beyond for their organization and their communities. This year's awardee was our very own Associate Chief Medical Officer Jeanelle Ahuna. She was nominated by Dr. John Vaz, CEO of Hawaii's Malama I Ke Ola Health Center. Dr. Vaz highlighted

Founded in 1993, the WCN was created to facilitate the convening, provision of training, and technical assistance to medical directors and other clinical leaders from federally qualified community health centers (FQHC). WCN's mission is to "promote the delivery of integrated, quality health care for all community residents, especially the underserved, by improving the abilities of, and providing opportunities for, safety-net clinical leaders to promote innovation and transform care delivery." It is a peer-led volunteer, professional association of clinical community health center leaders in the Western States.

#### "Women Who Mean Business" Awardee

Francine Dudoit-Tagupa ("Aunty Fran"), Waikiki Health's Director of Native Hawaiian Healing and Pu'uhonua Prison Program Director, received the 2023 Pacific Business News "Women Who Mean Business" Award, which honors accomplished women from diverse industries such as architecture, hospitality, and finance. The awards dinner brought together approximately 400 attendees, including Hawaii Lt. Gov. Sylvia Luke and the Waikiki Health leadership team, to honor Aunty Fran's achievements and dedication.

According to PBN, "These women are the

newsmakers, the leaders, and the ones shaping our future." The recognition of Aunty Fran's work elevates Waikiki Health's brand within the community.

Aunty Fran was nominated by Waikiki Health's CEO, Phyllis Dendle, who said, "Aunty Fran is in the business of serving others with skills, professionalism, and wholeheartedness. She has a powerful and lasting impact on her co-workers, Native Hawaiian Healing clients, Pu'uhonua participants and its network of partners." Aunty Fran said, "all the accolades and attention are humbling. I feel so blessed. But it's not about me, it's about the agency."

Aunty Fran began her career with Waikiki Health in 1998, where she fully integrated her Native Hawaiian Healing services with the agency's primary medical care offerings. Then in 2016, she implemented Waikiki Health's Pu'uhonua Prison program, aimed at aiding incarcerated men and women in their successful reentry into the community.



### Major Upgrades at Makahiki Clinic

In 2023, significant upgrades were completed at Waikiki Health's Harry and Jeanette Weinberg Makahiki Clinic. As part of the upgrades, the clinic saw the installation of two state-of-the-art A/C Rooftop Units. The goal is to have Makahiki Clinic achieve better indoor air quality throughout the three-story building, which houses a medical clinic with 19 exam rooms and a dental clinic with seven dental operatories, along with a pharmacy, patient waiting rooms and healthcare provider offices. Another feature of the upgrade is the use of ultraviolet (UV) lights, which kill airborne microbes, including bacteria and viruses, for a cleaner indoor environment.

Jay Tamashiro, Waikiki Health's Director of Operations, has been instrumental in overseeing the project's multiple phases encompassing installation, testing, balancing and adjustment. Another key component of the Makahiki Clinic upgrade project was the installation of an automatic front door opener to improve access for patients with mobility challenges.

It is worth noting that these Makahiki Clinic upgrades came at a cost of over \$620,000. The clinic, however, has not borne this financial burden alone. The State of Hawaii, recognizing our dedication to the health and welfare of our patients, provided a grant of \$320,000. In addition, generous contributions from our community, in the form of unrestricted donations, covered the balance.

## **Sites and Programs**

Waikiki Health service sites include primary care clinics, specialized clinics for women and youth, a shelter for unhoused adults (couples and individuals), and outreach locations. The health center's core service is primary care; however, social determinants of health – including economic stability, education level, social supports, environment, and access to health care – impact a person's overall health. For that reason, Waikiki Health also offers counseling, housing navigation, job training and educational programs targeting our houseless clients.

Ohua Clinic offers primary and preventive medical care fully integrated with behavioral health and Native Hawaiian Healing. Other services include HIV/Hepatitis C early intervention services, substance use disorder treatment, tobacco treatment, medical nutrition therapy, chronic disease management, pharmacy, and more. Health Education & Counseling Services, located next to Ohua Clinic, are offered by an RN care coordinator, behavioral health care coordinator, clinical psychologist, registered dietitian, tobacco treatment specialist, and health educators.

**Harry and Jeanette Weinberg Makahiki Clinic** offers medical and dental services, integrated behavioral health, optometry, tobacco treatment, and pharmacy services.

**PATH Clinic** assists pregnant, recently delivered and parenting women with a history of substance use disorders. PATH provides obstetrics/gynecology, primary medical care, pediatrics, behavioral health therapy, tobacco treatment, and enabling services such as insurance navigation. PATH also provides linkages to substance use treatment centers for women, including the Salvation Army Family Treatment Services' Women's Way, a residential and outpatient program that includes support for their children.

Youth Outreach (YO!) provides medical and social services to unaccompanied, runaway, homeless and at-risk youth and young adults of all genders, targeting those age 22 and younger. Drop-in services offered in a youth-friendly, culturally sensitive, nonjudgmental environment include meals, shower and laundry facilities, hygiene supplies, clothing, storage lockers, medical care, educational programs, employment assistance, housing referrals, and more. YO! is operated by Waikiki Health and Hale Kipa, a youth social services agency.

**Keauhou Shelter** accommodates 76 members (individuals and couples), in 64 private units. Keauhou provides meals, housing case management, and employs the Housing First model, providing housing followed by wrap-around services.

**Medical Mobile Clinic** is our "Clinic on Wheels" providing medical services at various locations across Oahu. Services are offered on-site at Salvation Army and Hina Mauka substance use disorder treatment programs.



**Telehealth** offers patients the option to meet with their healthcare provider virtually, which removes transportation or other barriers to accessing care.

Ryan White HIV/AIDS Program Part C and Early Intervention Services Program offers free, confidential, one-minute testing; prevention and treatment; health education; medication and nutrition counseling. Our HIV/AIDS Early Intervention Services (HEIS) Outreach Program provides risk-reduction counseling and testing to patients at substance use disorder treatment centers on Oahu and other islands.

**Pu'uhonua Prison Program** assists incarcerated men and women in transitioning back into the community and avoiding homelessness and recidivism. Pu'uhonua staff help participants create their "Going Home Plan for Success" and fill out applications for health insurance, food stamps, and other needs. Post-release, they receive referrals to shelters or clean & sober facilities; employment opportunities, Goodwill vouchers; a medical home at Waikiki Health; and more.

**Emergency Department Diversion Plan** helps reduce overutilization of hospital emergency rooms by patients with nonemergent medical conditions who could be assisted more appropriately at federally qualified community health centers (FQHC), including Waikiki Health.

#### Waikiki Health's Seven HRSA-Certified Sites:

Ohua Clinic, Makahiki Clinic, PATH Clinic, and YO! Youth Clinic are all Health Resources & Services Administration (HRSA) certified sites. Others are Waikiki Health's two Medical Mobile Clinics and Waikiki Health's designated service site at Jarrett Middle School, offering a low-income target population access to physical exams, vaccinations, wound care, TB tests, and health education.

## Health Fair at FDC Supports Post-Release Success

On July 20, 2023, Waikiki Health hosted a health fair at The Federal Detention Center (FDC). The goal was to educate incarcerated men and women about the services Waikiki Health offers to help them with their transition back into the community. Many of these services are provided both pre- and post-release through our Pu'uhonua Prison Program. Having a well-defined plan for returning home, a strong support system, and access to medical care is crucial for preventing a relapse into criminal behavior.

Waikiki Health staff in attendance at the health fair were Saif Quadri, Tobacco Treatment Specialist; Mayla Ngirausui, HIV Prevention Services Manager; Maireng Vicari, Program Assistant; Jacque Tellei, Director of PATH Clinic and YO!; Richard Kaai, Director of Homeless Services; and Cheryl Moreno, Eligibility Specialist. "It's so rewarding to be able to help people and know how grateful they are for that help," Maireng said. She added that so many of the FDC's men and women thanked them and said they felt relieved to know that they had people who cared about them once their transition back into the community begins.

Mayla shared her thoughts on the importance of educating the men and women at FDC in the areas of HIV/Hepatitis C (Hep C). "In prisons, HIV and Hep C are primarily related to sharing of drug injecting equipment, unclean tattoo work, and razor blade sharing. Also, the transmission of HIV and Hep C within prisons is linked to unprotected sexual contact." She also mentioned how rewarding it is to do this kind of work within an environment where Waikiki Health's mission and vision had become so clear for her. Mahalo to the staff for taking the time to help those who need it most.

## **PATH Clinic Welcomes New Ultrasound Machine**

Thanks to the Padosi Foundation, Waikiki Health's PATH Clinic is the proud owner of a state-of-the-art ultrasound machine. Donations awarded by Trustees of the Padosi Foundation, held in reserve, fully funded PATH's ultrasound. Ultrasound scans can confirm pregnancy, monitor baby's growth, determine the due date, and enhance mother-fetus bonding. Additionally, ultrasound imaging can diagnose non-pregnancy-related gynecological problems.

Describing PATH's new ultrasound, Jacque Tellei, Director of PATH Clinic and Youth Outreach, said, "She is beautiful and user-friendly. Patients have shared how clearly and easily they can see their baby on this machine compared to the older leased machine."

Dr. Michele Pangilinan, PATH's physician, said, "The ultrasound machine has become an invaluable tool to strengthen the maternal-fetal bond by connecting mothers to themselves and to their children in a way that brings hope, resilience and healing. It also provides accurate imaging for those who are uninsured and have no access to available services."

PATH Clinic (Perinatal Addiction Treatment of Hawaii), our women's clinic, is Hawaii's only comprehensive obstetrics/gynecology clinic for pregnant and parenting women with past or current substance use disorders.

## **Dental Screenings for Keiki**

In June 2023, Waikiki Health's Dental Director, Dr. Rachel DiPasquale, and Dr. Yuree Namkung, in partnership with the Hawaii Dental Service Foundation, performed dental screenings for 80 students in the Iolani School Ka'i Program. Started in 2010, Ka'i is a community partnership with Iolani School and Palolo Valley that provides free summer school programs during the school year for qualifying students. According to the HDS Foundation, "We're keeping healthy smiles top of mind for keiki in summer school programs."

The dental screenings were so well received that the director of Ka'i Keiki program asked Waikiki Health to screen an additional 50 children between the ages of 3 to 7. Dr. DiPasquale says, "We hope to continue assisting the Ka'i program in the years to come and become their dental home if they don't yet have one."

In addition to offering dental screenings for the Ka'i Keiki program, the Hawaii Dental Association and Waikiki Health hosted Give Kids A Smile Hawaii in February at the Makahiki Medical and Dental Clinic to celebrate Children's Oral Health Awareness Month. The event provided dental services and education to promote lifelong oral health for our keiki, with approximately 75 children receiving screenings, cleanings, and fluoride treatments.

Dr. DiPasquale emphasized that Give Kids A Smile isn't just about free dental checkups. Throughout the month, the foundation and volunteers visit elementary schools to provide education, which plays a vital role in the event, focusing on healthy eating choices, proper brushing and flossing techniques, and regular dental checkups. Empowering children with oral health knowledge can positively impact their overall well-being.

## **Keauhou Shelter's Goal: Homeless to Housed**

Over the recent 12-month period, from September 2022 through August 2023, Waikiki Health's staff at Keauhou Shelter placed 30 of its 96 residents, formerly homeless adults, (aka, Keauhou "members") into permanent housing.

Keauhou, which means "a new beginning," can accommodate 76 adults, including individuals and couples, in 64 private units. Members share communal bathrooms, showers, laundry facilities, and receive a daily dinner meal service. Keauhou Shelter is a low-barrier emergency shelter where homeless adults are enrolled directly from the street; staff do not perform background, income, credit, or medical checks. These are additional barriers homeless individuals often encounter when seeking transitional or permanent housing.

Richard Kaai, Waikiki Health's Director of Homeless Services, says, "Homelessness is a symptom. It's not the problem. People have personal issues that compound the problem, such as the sudden loss of a job or income, domestic issues, traumatic events, and a history of mental health or substance use disorders." Keauhou's services include housing case management, housing placement, healthcare referrals, assistance with obtaining personal documents, insurance navigation, tobacco treatment, mail services, and more. Staff also provide members with training in tenancy skills and work-readiness skills to help them secure employment.

## Youth Outreach "Talks Story" with Homeless Youth

Waikiki Health's Youth Outreach Program (YO!) assists homeless, runaway, and at-risk youth and young adults of all genders in the nonjudgmental, culturally sensitive, youth-friendly environment of our YO! Drop-in Center in Waikiki. Challenges faced by houseless youth include being victims of domestic violence, verbal abuse, sexual abuse, human trafficking, neglect, and substance use disorders. These factors put them at high risk for disruption in their education, shelter/food insecurity, teenage pregnancy and exposure to disease and violence.

To address the increasing demand from young people and staff for behavioral health services, YO! introduced its popular "Talk Story Clinic" in 2020, offering sessions with a licensed psychologist from Waikiki Health. The name "Talk Story Clinic" destigmatizes its use as a mental health support resource. Participation in multiple sessions has demonstrated YO! youths' strong desire and commitment to heal from their traumatic experiences and learn healthy coping strategies. Appointments increased from 24 sessions in 2020, to 109 in 2021, and 105 in 2022.

Established in 1989, YO! offers medical care and social services targeting youth up to age 22. YO! also assists Transitional Age Youth (TAY), age 18-24, including TAY families with one or more children. Educational and housing support is open to youth up to age 25. YO! staff help each youth meet their immediate needs, stabilize their lives, and set goals for their future. In 2022, 285 youth made 1,119 visits to the YO! Drop-in Center; 545 received YO! outreach services.





## Financial Overview (Year ending 12/31/22)




