
Dedicated Staff Members Honored and Recognized for Excellence

Dr. K Honored with HPCA Lifetime Achievement Award

Dr. Elliot Kalauawa ("Dr. K"), Waikiki Health's Chief Medical Officer, who has been serving Waikiki Health's patients since 1986, has been recognized numerous times for his exemplary career achievements. In 2024, Dr. K was honored once again by receiving the Hawaii Primary Care Association (HPCA) Kulia Lifetime Achievement Award.

The Kulia (outstanding) Lifetime Achievement Award honored Dr. K "in recognition of being a beacon of compassionate care, a tireless advocate for the medically underserved communities, and a pioneer in HIV/AIDS treatment, embodying the ethos of patient-centered medicine and inclusive healthcare for over three decades."

Throughout his career, Dr. K has consistently demonstrated a deep commitment to improving healthcare access for underserved populations, with his work in providing treatment for HIV/AIDS patients being particularly groundbreaking. Beyond his clinical expertise, Dr. K is known for his compassionate approach, ensuring that every patient, regardless of their background or health challenges, receives the highest quality of care.

Aunty Fran Receives 2024 Ka'ōnohi Award

Papa Ola Lōkahi (Native Hawaiian Health Care Systems) hosted the 2024 Ka'ōnohi Awards at Washington Place, where Francine Dudoit-Tagupa ("Aunty Fran"), Waikiki Health's Director of Native Hawaiian Healing and Pu'uhonua Prison Program, was honored. She was one of 12 individuals, along with one organization, recognized for their "contributions to the health and well-being of Native Hawaiians." Waikiki Health offers primary medical care that is fully integrated with Aunty Fran's Native Hawaiian Healing modalities.

Honorees "represented many areas of excellence," according to Papa Ola Lōkahi, including health care, traditional healing, policy, activism, workforce development, leadership, health promotion, and education. Papa Ola Lōkahi has presented the Ka'ōnohi Award since 1994. The award is named after Dr. Alexander Ka'ōnohi, a naturopathic physician, pharmacist, and botanist. Descended from healers, Dr. Ka'ōnohi integrated both western and traditional practices into his healing services.

Aunty Fran comes from a lineage of Native Hawaiian healers who taught her skills that are valued both in the Native Hawaiian and general community. She has been a Registered Nurse and Native Hawaiian Healing Practitioner since 1978. She has initiated pilot programs to integrate Hawaiian healing with Western medicine that provides personalized healing treatment and improve the health of the community.

Jeanelle Ahuna: Two More Feathers for Her Cap!

Jeanelle Ahuna, Waikiki Health's Associate Chief Medical Officer, who earned her Doctor of Medical Science degree, also received the Capstone Award of Excellence from A.T. Still University of Health Sciences (ATSU). Her Doctor of Medical Science degree is focused on clinical care, designed specifically for the physician assistant. ATSU is a leading healthcare sciences university and was the world's first osteopathic medical school. The school is based in Kirksville, Missouri, with campuses in Arizona and California. Osteopathic Medicine is fully aligned with Waikiki Health's holistic approach to healthcare, which treats the whole person, not just the symptoms.

As Associate Chief Medical Officer, Jeanelle joins Dr. Elliot Kalauawa, Waikiki Health's Chief Medical Officer, in overseeing all health center operations, including medical services, staff training and medical protocols across all clinic sites. Jeanelle is responsible for the diagnosis, medication management, treatment, and preventive care plans of various conditions, including HIV/AIDS, gender-affirming care, hepatitis, and diabetes.

Jeanelle joined the Waikiki Health Primary Care team in 2008; she has been active in community service and was honored many times for her achievements. One example: Jeanelle was named a Pacific Business News "40 Under 40" honoree in 2020. She also was awarded the Western Clinician's Network's Clinical Excellence award in 2023. She was nominated by Dr. John Vaz, CEO, Malama I Ke Ola Health Center. Jeanelle once described her dedication to providing direct services to Waikiki Health patients as follows: "Every day presents a new face, a new challenge or new opportunity that I embrace fully."

Sites and Programs

Waikiki Health, a Federally Qualified Health Center (FQHC), operates a network of fixed service sites in urban Honolulu, including two primary care clinics, specialized clinics for women and youth, a shelter for unhoused adults, and a school-based clinic. Waikiki Health also introduced successful community-based initiatives, collaborating with hospitals, correctional facilities, substance use disorder treatment programs and other partners. In addition to its core service – Primary Care – Waikiki Health addresses the Social Determinants of Health (SDOH) which impact overall health, offering counseling, housing navigation, job training, educational programs, and other social services to our houseless clients. In 2023, Waikiki Health provided 63,768 Primary Care visits (58,642 in-clinic and 5,126 telehealth visits) to 10,271 patients.

Ohua Clinic offers primary and preventive medical care fully integrated with behavioral health and Native Hawaiian Healing. Other services include HIV/Hepatitis C early intervention services, substance use disorder treatment, tobacco treatment, medical nutrition therapy, chronic disease management, pharmacy, and more.

Health Education & Counseling Services Annex, adjacent to Ohua Clinic, offers the services of a RN care coordinator, behavioral health care coordinator, clinical psychologist, dietitian, tobacco treatment specialist, and health educators.

Harry and Jeanette Weinberg Makahiki Clinic houses both a Medical Clinic and Dental Clinic, providing integrated behavioral health, optometry, tobacco treatment, and pharmacy services.

PATH Clinic assists pregnant and parenting women with a history of substance use disorders. Services include obstetrics/gynecology, primary medical care, pediatrics, behavioral health therapy, medication assisted treatment, tobacco treatment, and enabling services such as insurance navigation. PATH also provides linkages to substance use treatment centers for women, including the Salvation Army Family Treatment Services' Women's Way.

Youth Outreach (YO!) Drop-in Center and Youth Clinic

provides medical and social services to houseless and at-risk youth and young adults of all genders, targeting those age 22 and younger. YO! also assists Transitional Age Youth (TAY), age 18-24, including young TAY families with children. Educational and housing opportunities are open to youth up to age 25. Services include meals, shower and laundry facilities, hygiene supplies, clothing, lockers, medical care, educational programs, employment assistance, and housing referrals. YO! is operated by Waikiki Health and Hale Kipa, a youth social services agency.

Keauhou Shelter accommodates 76 members (individuals and couples), in 64 private units. Keauhou provides meals, housing case management, and employs the Housing First model, providing housing followed by wrap-around services.

Ryan White Part C Early Intervention Services (EIS) Program

is committed to the early detection and treatment of HIV, which can help prevent the onset of AIDS and other opportunistic infections. Waikiki Health is at the forefront of HIV medicine and prevention, providing comprehensive care since 1992, and is the preeminent provider of prevention and holistic services for those impacted by HIV/AIDS in Hawaii.

Pu`uhonua Prison Program, a model Reentry Program, assists incarcerated men and women in returning to the community and avoiding homelessness and recidivism. While Pu`uhonua ("A Safe Place of Healing") is presented in a cultural framework, targeting Native Hawaiians and Pacific Islanders who are over-represented in Oahu correctional facilities, the program is designed to benefit any incarcerated man or woman.

Waiwai Ola Emergency Department Diversion Plan reduces over-utilization of hospital emergency rooms by patients with nonemergent concerns who could be assisted more appropriately at FQHCs, including Waikiki Health.

HRSA-Certified Sites: Ohua Clinic, Makahiki Clinic, PATH Clinic, YO! Youth Clinic, Jarrett Middle School Clinic, and two Medical Mobile Clinics are all Health Resources & Services Administration (HRSA) certified sites.

Housing First Partners Conference, Focusing on **Homelessness Solutions**

Waikiki Health's Director of Homeless Services, Richard Kaai, and Housing First Manager, Troy Moreno, joined other professionals, researchers, and policymakers in the field of homelessness at the 2024 Housing First Partners Conference (HFPC) in Atlanta. The HFPC aimed to foster a collaborative environment, showcasing innovation and best practices in Housing First programs across homelessness services. Conference attendance exceeded 1,200, with participants representing 49 states and 4 countries. The event featured over 80 workshops focused on education and training to support the Housing First and Permanent Supportive Housing models.

Richard attended several workshops, including one on staffing and employee retention for those working directly in homeless services, such as Waikiki Health's Keauhou Shelter. He mentioned that hiring employees with "lived experience" helps improve employment retention rates, as staff with real-life experiences tend to adapt better and relate more effectively to our clients (members). Troy also participated in several workshops, including a session focused on best practices for addressing mental health, domestic violence, and substance use disorders within homeless shelter facilities like Keauhou.

Richard stated, "Homelessness is a housing problem. If we secure housing first and then provide wrap-around services for support, there is a better chance for a successful transition out of homelessness."

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

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

Waikiki Health Expands Dental Clinic with New Operatory, Boosting Patient Access

Waikiki Health's Dental Clinic, housed at our Weinberg Makahiki Clinic, created an additional operatory to perform dental treatments and procedures. Oral health is an essential component of overall health and poor oral health has been linked to various diseases. Dental services also impact a person's sense of well-being and confidence. Adding the 8th operatory enables our dental staff to accommodate more patients and reduce wait time for appointments. Equipment for the operatory was purchased with donations from Padosi Foundation and the Lindhout Joint Revocable Trust.

As of January 1, 2023, the Hawaii legislature restored adult dental Medicaid (Med-QUEST) benefits after more than 10 years of suspending benefits for adults due to costs. Med-QUEST now covers adult preventative services, diagnostic and radiology, endodontic therapy, and restorative services. In 2023, 7,615 services were provided during 6,346 dental appointments.

Support for Incarcerated Individuals at Correctional Facilities' Health Fairs

Hawaii's correctional facilities annually hold Health Fairs and other events for the benefit of incarcerated men and women that help inform them that numerous medical and social service resources in our community want to assist them both pre- and post-release.

Waiawa Correctional Facility's Social Service Day had the goal of involving many organizations in order to demonstrate the various ways men incarcerated there could receive assistance. Waikiki Health's Pu'uhonua Prison Program was represented at Waiawa by Eligibility Specialist Cheryl Moreno and Program Assistant Maireng Vicari. Cheryl said, "a lot of the men knew about Waikiki Health already and heard good things. Everyone seemed grateful and excited to know that there is so much help available." Pu'uhonua Prison Program was developed to help those incarcerated in creating their "Going Home Plan for Success" that serves as a personal road map to transition back into the community and connect with appropriate health and social service providers.

The Federal Detention Center's Health

Fair was attended by 125 incarcerated men and women. Waikiki Health was represented by staff from many programs and services, including Pu'uhonua Prison Program, Keauhou Shelter, PATH Clinic, Youth Outreach, Behavioral Health, Early Intervention Services (EIS), and Tobacco Treatment. Attendees learned that they could choose Waikiki Health as a welcoming, nonjudgmental medical home upon their release.



(Total Patient Visits in 2023 - 63,768)



Financial Overview (Year ending 12/31/23*) *unaudited




